Also, amend bill by adding an additional section thereto to be known as section 41 and to read as follows:

“Section 41. To a deed of conveyance from John T. Morris to the Trustees of Otterbeins Chapel of the Church of the United Brethren in Christ, in the city of Baltimore, dated December 22d, 1885, recorded among the said records of Baltimore city, in Liber J. B., No. 1079, folio 279, &c., and to grant therein contained and set forth.
