Also, favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 234, of Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Receiving Stolen Goods, Money or Securities," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a second time.
