of the law which have heretofore occurred, but all such costs and violations shall be prosecuted as if the law hereby repealed was still in force.

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

House bill entitled an Act to pay Wm. Flaherty fifty-four dollars and fifty-seven cents, money paid by him to the State Treasurer for license.

Mr. Brennan submitted the following proposed amendment:

## AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend the bill by adding section 2 to follow section 1.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer in favor of Wm. Henry and Mary J. Beecher, for the sum of \$57.00, and refund to them the said amount, which is the proportionate part of the license fee paid by them to the State Treasurer for dredging license not wholly used.

Which was adopted.
