Also, unfavorably,

House bill entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 75, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Pleading, Practice and Process."

Which report was adopted.

Mr. Carter, from the Committee on Judiciary, reported favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Article 89, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Statistics and Information as to Branches of Industry," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Carter moved a suspension of the rules, in order to put said bill entitled an Act to repeal Article 89, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Statistics and Information as to Branches of Industry," upon its second reading.

The rules were suspended, (two-thirds of all the members-elect) voting in the affirmative, by yeas and nays, as follows:
