Mr. Collins introduced.

House bill entitled an Act to refund to James Nichols the sum of \$6.60 for State taxes erroneously paid into the State Treasury.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Claims.

Mr. Combs introduced,

House bill entitled an Act to refund to Wm. A. Lyon, Collector of Taxes in the Seventh Election District of St. Mary's County, a sum of money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of the State.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Claims.

Mr. Sams introduced,

House bill entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 4 of the Constitution of this State.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Amendments to the Constitution.

Mr. Collins introduced,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 1 and 2, of Article 61, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Manures and Fertilizers," as amended by the Acts of 1890, and to re-enact the same with amedments.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.
