#### REPORTS OF SELECT COMMITTEES.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

I have the honor to herewith return to your Honorable Body, without my approval, House Bill No. 16, entitled an Act to incorporate the Home for the Aged of Frederick city.

The general features of the bill meet my approval, objecting only to the third section, which exempts the property of the proposed corporation from taxation.

I am aware that the property which they may acquire is exempt under our general law, but I cannot approve of a special exemption from taxation.
