House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 41, of Article 39, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Fish and Fisheries," sub-title "Potomac," in so far as the same relates to black bass, and to reenact the same, and to add thereto four additional sections after section 47 of said Article, for the purpose of more fully protecting fresh water black bass in the waters of Maryland.
