## LEAVES TO INTRODUCE BILLS.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Labor to introduce a bill entitled an Act to amend Article one hundred of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Work," by adding thereto a section to be known as section five, providing for the weekly payment of wages to employes.
