Leave was granted to the Anne Arundel County Delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 79, of Article 2, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel County," sub-title "Birds, Game and Foxes."

Leave was granted to the Frederick County Delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to protect the trout in the streams of Frederick county, and to repeal and re-enact with amendments chapter 42 of the Acts of 1890.
