Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay R. C. Mackall for expenses incurred under an appointment made by his Excellency, Elihu E. Jackson, late Governor, as a delegate to the Southern Emigration Convention.

Mr. Carter, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably, with proposed amendment,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 296, of Article 73, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Process," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

#### AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

And whenever any trust or guarantee company which shall be authorized and empowered under the laws of this State to insure the fidelity of persons holding places of trust or responsibility in, to, or under any State, county, city, corporation, company, person or persons whatsoever; or to become security for the faithful performance of any trust, office, duty, contract or agreement, and to supercede any judgments, or to go any appeal or other bond, then any such trust or guarantee company shall be liable to be sued in any of the counties of this State or in the city of Baltimore, wherever any such bond shall be given or liability incurred by such trust or guarantee company, and process shall be served upon any such trust or guarantee company as hereinbefore provided for by this section, and such process shall be issued to the Sheriff of any county or the city of Baltimore, and shall be made returnable to the Clerk of the Court of such county or city of Baltimore, from which the same was issued.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to certain bequests in the last will and testament and cordicils thereto, of Susanna Warfield, deceased.
