any stallion kept for service by proclaiming or publishing fraudulent or false pedigrees or records, and to protect such owners or agents and the collection of fees for services of such stallions, and to prevent the entering of trotting horses out of their classes.

A bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the Governor of the State of Maryland to appoint an additional Justice of the Peace for the First Precinct of the Fourth Election District of Caroline county.

A bill entitled an Act authorizing and directing H. Fillmore Lankford, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Somerset county, to refund to George M. France the sum of \$48 for illegal fines paid by him, for alleged violation of the local oyster law of Somerset county, in the State of Maryland.

Were severally read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
