

House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments new section 137, of Article 33, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Elections," as enacted by the Acts of 1890, chapter 538.

Was read a third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:

Chapter 55. An Act to repeal sections 161 and 162, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Washington County," sub-title "Hagerstown," and to re-enact the following in lieu thereof in amending and revising the charter of Hagerstown and providing for the government thereof.
