## AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Amend enacting clause by making the section section 5 instead of section 4.

Add the following section to follow section 3:

"Section 4. And be it enacted, That at said election to be held on the first Monday in April, in the present year, the qualified voters of said town be and they are hereby authorized to cast a ballot "For the appointment of officers," or "Against the appointment of officers," and if the majority of votes be "For the appointment of officers," then sections 207 and 237, as by this Act repealed and re-enacted, shall be in full force and effect, but if the majority of votes cast be "Against the appointment of officers," then said sections 207 and 237, as herein repealed and re-enacted, shall be of none effect and said sections shall remain
