

And be it further resolved, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby directed to mail a copy of this resolution to each of the Savings Banks and such incorporated institutions in this State as may be affected by this resolution at once, and shall keep records thereof.

Mr. Carter, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to amend Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Chancery," sub-title "Infants," by adding six additional sections thereto, to come in after section 62, and to be numbered respectively 62 A, 62 B, 62 C, 62 D, 62 E and 62 F.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to amend Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," by adding a new sub-title to be known as "Bawdy Houses and Houses of Ill Fame," and add a new section to be known as "Section 16 A."

Which were severally read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
