Mr. Carter, from the Committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller and Treasurer of the State of Maryland to audit the claims of Oscar Ruckle and others for money erroneously paid to the State of Maryland.

Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 653 D, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as said section appears in chapter 843 of the Acts of 1890.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Berret, from the Committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to pay the claim of J. H. Medairy & Co., for stationery furnished the Executive and Legislative Departments, Court of Appeals and State Library for 1891 and 1892.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to provide for the removal of the body of General Smallwood to some suitable place in the city of Baltimore.

Which were severally read a first time.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council to appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a site and the erection thereon of a statue of the late Johns Hopkins.
