HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

The following Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, originating in the House of Delegates, were presented to the Governor for his approval on Saturday, March 12th, 1892, at 10.30 o'clock A. M. :

Chapter 99. An Act to repeal section 51, of Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Destroying Property Maliciously," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Chapter 100. An Act to repeal and re-enact with an amendment section 171, of Article 93, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Guardian and Ward," as repealed and re-enacted by the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, January Session, 1890, chapter 211.

Chapter 101. An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 1, of chapter 589, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed January Session, 1890, entitled an Act to protect birds and game and prevent trespassing with dog or gun on private property in Somerset county.

Chapter 102. An Act to pay Charles F. Rowe, late Collector of State Taxes for Frederick county, for years 1888 and 1889, a sum of money for State taxes paid by him into the Treasury erroneously.

Chapter 103. An Act to incorporate the Dorman & Smyth Hardware Company.
