Whereas, By inadvertence the sum of \$700 was, by order of March 1st, 1872, directed to be expended for the printing of the reports of the Maryland Agricultural College and Experimental Station, when it was the intention of this House to expend a sum not exceeding \$1,000 to that end. Be it further ordered, that an additional sum of \$300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be expended for defraying the cost of printing the said reports as provided in said order of March 1st, 1892.
