Also,

Senate bill entitled an Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore Traction Company of Baltimore city, and to enable said company to use the electric power known as Trolly System for the propulsion of its cars upon its railways.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Corporations.
