With recommendation that said bill be referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Bill so referred.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 15, of Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Licenses," sub-title "Brokers," and to repeal section 18 of said Article, as amended by chapter 420, Acts of 1890.

Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 3, of Article 30, of the Code Public General Laws of Maryland, entitled "Deaf, Dumb and Blind, Education of."
