Mr. Laird submitted the following proposed amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add as section 24 the following, and number the following sections correctly:

"Sec. 24. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of every person residing in any county or city of this State, and of every person who owns any personal property permanently located in any county or city of this State, though he does not reside therein, to deliver to the assessors of his or her district, a copy of the schedule in section twenty-one of this Act provided, duly filled and signed, on or before the day on which the said assessors shall call upon such person for the purpose of assessing his property; and to the Board of County Commissioners of the county in which said person may reside, or said property may be permanently located, or to the Appeal Tax Court
