In line 97, section 4, after the word "district," add "for which there shall be appointed two assessors at large and also one assessor for each Election District in said county, each of which said District Assessors, but only for the district in which he shall be appointed shall join an act with the said two assessors at large for said county, in assessing all property herein required to be assessed in the Election District only for which he shall be so appointed.
