The dispensary is in first-class condition, except that owing to the limited means at the disposal of the management it is deficient in many things necessary to the degree of perfection requisite for such an institution.

The cooking and sleeping apartments are in excellent condition, entirely well regulated, and highly commendatory of the good management of the institution.

In a word, the whole institution is so well kept, every appearance is so favorable, the charity itself is so worthy that your Committee recommend that the full appropriation asked for be granted if in the judgment and wisdom of the Committee on Ways and Means they find that the condition of the State Treasury will justify such an appropriation; all of which is respectfully submitted.
