SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

Requesting and urging the Senators and Representatives of the State of Maryland, in the Congress of the United States, to use their best efforts to secure the passage of Senate bill, No. 67, entitled a bill to transfer the Revenue Marine Service from the Treasury Department of the United States to the Naval Department.
