Chapter 170. An Act to authorize and direct the Sheriff, Justices of the Peace and other officers of Calvert county to pay over to the Treasurer of said county all moneys for fines, &c.

Chapter 171. An Act to extend the privileges, enlarge the powers and amend the charter of the Salisbury Permanent Building and Loan Association of Wicomico county, a corporation duly incorporated under the General Laws of this State.
