And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority to make all such ordinances, by-laws and regulations not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this State, as from time to time they may deem wise, equitable and efficient for the promotion of the comfort, health and prosperity of said town and its inhabitants, for the suppression of vice and immorality, and for the prevention or removal of nuisances within the limits of said town, and shall have power to levy every year an equal
