CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT to declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to the bequest of David Johnson, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, to the Second "Universalist Society" of the city of Baltimore.

Preamble. Whereas David Johnson, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, by his last will and testament, duly admitted to probate in the Orphans' Court for Baltimore city, on or about the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, bequeathed to the Second Universalist Society of the city of Baltimore all his estate, real and personal, of every kind whatever, excepting a certain specific bequest, and with certain conditions thereunto annexed, all of which are fully set forth in the said last will and testament; therefore

Bequest sanctioned. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given to the said bequest.
