108. If any of the owners of property assessed within said town shall conceive themselves aggreived Appeal when by the assessment made by said assessors, they may aggreeved. appeal to said burgess and commissioners, who may make such reduction in their assessments as they shall deem just and right, provided the person so aggreived shall take such appeal within sixty days after such assessment is made, by notifying the said burgess and commissioners of said appeal.

109. The said burgess and commissioners may pass all by-laws and ordinances necessary to give effect and operation to all the powers vested in them, and the corporation may impose fines for the breach of Impose fines. their ordinances and recover the same in the name of said corporation before any justice of the peace of said county, in the same manner as small debts are recovered, but no such ordinance shall impose a fine for any offence exceeding ten dollars.

110. Said burgess and commissioners may make all such by-laws and ordinances, not contrary to law, as they may deem expedient for the protection of the health, comfort, convenience and prosperity of removal of. the town and its inhabitants, for the prevention or removal of nuisances, and suppression of vice and immorality within the town.

111. If any person shall neglect or refuse to pay any fine imposed on him for a violation of any ordinance of said corporation, the burgess and com- Burgessmay missioners may commit him to the county jail, or commit. town lock-up, for a space of time not exceeding ten days.

112. The burgess and commissioners may pass ordinances providing for laying out, leveling, repair- Footwaysing or building footways in said town, and direct lay out, &c. the materials out of which the same may be made, and provide for collecting the costs thereof from the owners of the different lots bordering on such footways.

113. The burgess shall be treasurer of the corporation, and shall give bond thereto approved by the Bond. commissioners, or a majority of them, in the penalty of two thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful
