

June next thereafter, deliver to the collector of taxes a copy of said levy, showing the amount of taxes due [due] from each taxpayer.

121. The collector of taxes shall, within fifteen days after he receives the copy of the levy as herebefore provided for, deliver to each taxpayer his tax bill. Deliver tax bills.

122. If any taxpayer should fail to pay his taxes within sixty days after the collector of taxes has delivered to him his tax bill, then the said collector is hereby empowered and authorized to distrain for said taxes in the same manner (and with the same costs) that collectors of county taxes are authorized to distraint for taxes. Distrain for taxes.

123. The collector of taxes shall give bond with security to be approved by the burgess and commissioners in the penalty of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties, and said bonds shall be recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Garrett county. Give bond and have it recorded.

124. The collector of taxes shall report in writing to the burgess and commissioners at every regular meeting held by them the amount of taxes collected by him since last meeting of said burgess and commissioners, together with the names of the persons from whom collections have been made, and the amount collected from each, and said report shall be recorded by the town clerk, and the said collector shall, at the time he makes his report as aforesaid, pay over to the treasurer the amount collected by him less his commission, which shall be ten per cent. of the amount collected. Report am't of taxes collected.

125. It shall be the duty of the town clerk to be present at all the meetings of the burgess and commissioners. He shall keep a correct record of their proceedings, and an accurate account of all their financial transactions. He shall enter all ordinances passed by the burgess and commissioners and signed by the burgess, in a book kept by him for that purpose, and the books of said corporation shall be open for the inspection of any taxpayer at all times, and copies of all ordinances shall be put up in the Clerk to keep record.
