upwards, and who have resided within the limits of the corporation for the space of six months next preceding the election, shall on the first Saturday of April in each and every year, at such place as directed by the Mayor and Common Council, between the hours of twelve o'clock M. and four o'clock P. M. elect a Mayor and five Councilmen, of the age of twenty-five years and upwards, who have resided there twelve months next preceding the election; and in case of a tie, vote at any election, the Mayor shall give ten days notice of a new election to decide the choice between them.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT in relation to the road running from Glymont, on Potomac river, through Cornwallis' neck, in Charles county, to the point of its termination.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the road running from Glymont through Cornwallis' neck to the mouth of Mattawoman creek, in Charles county, be and the same is Road exhereby excepted from the provisions of the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter two hundred and ninety-one.
