

Relief and advantage afforded. have all the relief and advantage afforded, and provided in sections one hundred and seventy, one hundred and seventy-one, one hundred and seventy-two, one hundred and seventy-three, one hundred and seventy-four, and one hundred and seventy-five of the general incorporation act of this State, as fully as if the same were herein at length set forth; provided, that at the next election for municipal officers in said town of Emmittsburg, this act shall be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of said town for their adoption or rejection, and said election shall be by ballot, and such ballots shall have written or printed thereon the words "For widening street" or, "Against widening street," as said voters may elect, and if a majority of the votes so cast shall be against widening said street, then this act shall be of no effect, otherwise, it shall be and remain in full force.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 152.

AN ACT to repeal chapter four hundred and twenty-nine, of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled an act to incorporate a company to construct a turnpike road from Hagerstown, in Washington county, to the town of Sharpsburg, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, chapter one hundred and twenty-nine, and to re-enact the said section with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That chapter four hundred and twenty-nine, of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-
