

to be forfeited, which shall be delivered to the sheriff, if it shall have been seized by any of said officers other than the sheriff, and said sheriff, unless security be given for the restoration of said property, in case of conviction, shall retain it in his custody, and upon conviction of the offender, the sheriff shall sell said property at public auction to the highest bidder after ten days' notice, put up at the court-house door in Belair, the sheriff to be allowed the same costs as in a *fieri facias*. Sell to highest bidder.

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted*, That the president and directors of the Agricultural and Mechanical Society of Harford county be hereby authorized to appoint a special police force to enforce the provisions of this act during the days of any exhibitions of said society. Appoints special police.

SEC. 5. *Be it enacted*, That none of the provisions of this act shall apply to persons selling wine or malt liquors within the grounds of said society with the consent thereof. Shall apply.

SEC. 6. *Be it enacted*, That this act take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 154.

AN ACT to add an additional section to the Code of Public General Laws, article twenty-six, title "Corporations," prohibiting the issue of notes or obligations in place of money or loans, to be called sub-section A.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That an additional section shall be added to article twenty-six of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," to be called sub-section A, and to read as follows: Additional section.
