Shall be out of the same, shall be applied to the repairing of said road and keeping the same in good condition for travel, and to no other purpose whatsoever, and the supervisor of said road hereinbefore provided for shall receive from the toll-gatherers all sums of money collected in their respective counties, and shall expend the same in making such repairs under the direction and supervision of the commissioners of their respective counties, and said commissioners shall have the same control over such supervisors as they now have over other road supervisors appointed by them.

Insufficient for the repair.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That if in the opinion of either of said boards of County Commissioners the receipts from tolls in their respective counties are insufficient for the proper repair of said road, then said commissioners are authorized and empowered to levy such additional sum for such purpose as may be deemed necessary upon the taxable property of their respective counties, and to see that the same is properly expended by the supervisor appointed by them in making such repairs.

Properly expended.

All obligations. Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That all obligations, express or implied, assumed by this State in taking control of said road from the General Government, are hereby placed upon and required to be assumed by the respective boards of County Commissioners of the counties aforesaid.

Requested to pass act.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, in Congress assembled, be and are hereby requested to pass an act giving their sanction and consent to this act.

In force.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect when the Congress of the United States shall have passed an act giving the consent of the United States to the provisions of this act.
