

for trespass according to law, without the knowledge and consent of the party impounding the same, or his lawful agent, he, she or they shall be deemed guilty of a felony, and upon indictment and conviction therefor, shall be sentenced to confinement in the penitentiary of Maryland for not less than six months nor more than one year, at the discretion of the court. Guilty of felony.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That if any person or persons shall go upon the land of another in said county and extend a fence from the land in his, her or their occupation to the fence upon the land of such other person, without his knowledge and consent previously obtained, the same shall be and it is hereby adjudged a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before a justice of the peace of the county aforesaid, the person or persons so offending shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars and costs, and be committed to the county jail until such fine and costs are paid, or thirty days, which ever shall first occur; provided, previous notice be given to such person or persons not to extend such fence, by the party whose land is trespassed upon as aforesaid, or his tenant or lawful agent. Shall go and extend fence.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the first day of May next. In force.

CHAPTER 163.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking and catching of oysters for sale in certain waters in Calvert county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall not be lawful for any person to take or catch oysters for sale with rakes, tongs or any other instrument whatever in the waters of Mill creek, Back Creek or Saint John's creek, in Not lawful.
