CHAPTER 179.

AN ACT to lay out and establish a new election district in Frederick county, out of part of Liberty District, number eight, to be called Linganore District, or election district number nineteen.

New election district. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a new election district be laid out and established out of part of Liberty District, number eight of Frederick county, the said district to be known and called by the name of Linganore District, or election district number nineteen.

Boundaries. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the boundaries of said district shall be as follows, to wit: Beginning at a white oak tree at the intersection of the Coppermine road with the Johnsville District line, running thence south to the spring-house of Henry Carter, thence with spring branch to New Liberty road, thence south to the bend in the public road west of the dwelling-house of William H. Baker, thence with said public road until it intersects the Woodville District line, thence with said line to the Carroll county line, thence with said Carroll county line until it intersects Johnsville District line, thence with said line to the place of beginning, the territory included within these boundaries to be known by the name of Linganore District, or election district number nineteen, as aforesaid.

Linganore District.

Place of holding elections. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the place of holding elections in said Linganore District, or election district number nineteen, shall be Unionville.

Shall be appointed. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That there shall be appointed by the proper authority two justices of
