

the proportion of expenses chargeable to each proprietor or owner, and may recover the same by action in the Circuit Court, or before the justice of the peace, according to the amount awarded, or may distrain the personal property of such proprietor or owner at any time within six months from the time when the ascertainment of the proportion of such proprietor or owner shall be made by the Street Commissioner; provided, that ten days' notice shall be given by the Mayor to the said proprietor or owner of the amount of his or her assessment, prior to such suit or distress.

Section added SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the following section is hereby added to said charter of said town of Frostburg, to be numbered thirty-four, to read as follows:

Violating any ordinance. SEC. 34. *And be it enacted*, That in cases in which any person or persons shall be found guilty of violating any ordinance of the town, it shall and may be lawful for the Mayor or any justice of the peace trying said cause, upon conviction of the offender, to impose the fine prescribed by the particular ordinance under which said person or persons is or are tried, and upon failure or refusal of the party thus convicted to pay such fine and costs, to commit such person or persons thus convicted to the town lock-up for a time not exceeding five days, or to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Failure or refusal to pay fine. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall go into effect immediately upon its passage.
