shall be included five scalps or less in one certificate, and two cents additional for every scalp over five contained therein.

199 b. The Treasurer of said county, upon presentation of such certificate, shall pay to the party holding the same the sum of thirty cents for every hawk or owl, and the sum of twenty-five cents for Compensat'n every weasel specified therein as having been pro-certificate. duced before said magistrate, and sworn to have been bona fide killed or destroyed in said county as afore-

199 c. The Commissioners of said county shall, in making their annual levy in each year, levy in the hands of said Treasurer a contingent fund to meet Levy for conthe payments required to be made by him under the tingent fund. last preceding section, and if at the end of the year such sum shall prove to have been insufficient, they shall levy such additional sum therefor as may be necessary.

199 d. If the Treasurer shall for any reason refuse to pay the sums provided to be paid by this act, upon presentation of the certificates of said justices herein specified, then an action shall lie against the Com-cover. missioners of said county to recover the sums herein designated to be paid for the killing or destroying of any such hawk, owl or weasel aforesaid.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force. effect from the date of its passage.
