

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That all persons holding a license under this act are hereby vested with power and authority to arrest without warrant all persons who may be detected by them in violating any of its provisions, or of the provisions of article ninety-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, regulating the shooting of wild fowl, remaining in force over said waters after the passage of this act, and to carry such person or persons before a justice of the peace, to be dealt with according to the provisions of this act, if violating the same, or according to the provisions of article ninety-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, if in violation of the provisions of said article in relation to the shooting of wild fowl. Arrest without warrant.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted,* That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act be and the same are hereby repealed. Acts inconsistent repealed

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CHAPTER 294.

AN ACT to pay to Margaret S. Mitchell, a widow, and to William B. Wirt, John S. Wirt and Henry B. Wirt, a sum of money erroneously paid by them into the treasury.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay Margaret S. Mitchell, a widow, and William B. Wirt, John S. Wirt and Henry B. Wirt, the heirs at law of John W. Wirt, deceased, the aggregate sum of thirty dollars and forty-seven cents, the same having been erroneously paid by them into the Treasury. Money erroneously paid.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.
