

into its custody and care, in which shall be stated the date of admission, the name and age of the child at the time of admission, the name of the person or justice by whom or the court by which committed, and the name of the nearest relatives when known to the corporation or its officer charged with the admission of inmates.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the foundlings and infant orphan and other destitute children under the care and charge of the said corporation, the Protestant Infant Asylum of Baltimore City, shall be and remain under the control and restraint and under the charge of the said corporation, and of the officers and managers and agents thereof, and bound to obedience to its rules, regulations and discipline to every effect, as apprentices are bound in respect of their masters and mistresses, and subject to all laws concerning the duties, liabilities, privileges and rights of apprentices. Remain under charge of corporation.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 298.

AN ACT to incorporate the Baltimore, Highlandtown and Riverview Railroad Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Anthony J. Schroeder, Theodore A. Bokel, Henry C. Schroeder, Michael Adams and James T. Kirby be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, under the direction of a majority of whom subscriptions may be received to the capital stock of the Baltimore, Highlandtown and Riverview Railroad Company, which is hereinafter incorporated; and that the said commissioners, or a majority of them, may cause books to be opened at Commissioners.
