receiving such an appointment shall pledge himself upon entering the College that he will continue a student thereof for the full term of four years, unless prevented by unavoidable necessity, and that he will teach school within the State for not less than two years immediately after leaving College, or as soon thereafter as may be practicable.

## CHAPTER 316.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and thirtyseven of article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Distribution," and to re-enact the same to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section one hundred and thirty-Repealed and seven of article ninety-three of the Code of Public re-enacted. General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Distribution," be repealed, and is hereby re-enacted to read as follows:

Sec. 137. If any legal representative shall appear after payment has been made under the preceding section, the Board of County School Commissioners Pay to reprereceiving such payment shall pay the same to such sentative. representative; but no collateral more remote than brothers' and sisters' children shall claim under this section.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force. effect from the date of its passage.
