Levy for expenses incurred.

SUB-Section A. The commissioners shall annually, for the use of the sheriff of said county, levy the sum of thirty dollars for the first, and ten dollars for each subsequent prisoner who may be convicted at any term of the Circuit Court for Dorchester county during the current year, in payment for the trouble and expenses incurred by said sheriff in transferring such prisoners to the penitentiary or houses of correction, as the case may be.

SEC. 2. Be it enacted, That sub-section A of this act shall take effect from the date of its passage, and section two hundred and ten with the induction into office of the next succeeding sheriff.
