

Furnish certificate for work done. missioners; and upon the completion thereof, the chairman of the board may furnish a certificate of the fact, stating the amount due for the work as done, which certificate shall be accepted by the collector of county taxes as so much cash, to an amount not exceeding two-thirds of the road tax due by such tax-payer.

Divide into sub-districts. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the road commissioners so appointed shall, within ten days after receiving notice of their appointment, and having taken the oath of office, proceed to organize their respective boards, and shall meet for the transaction of business, at such time and place as they may determine, and when called by the chairman; and they shall divide their respective districts into three sub-districts as nearly equal in extent as practicable, and to assign to each commissioner the sub-district over which he shall have special supervision.

Keep record. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That each commissioner shall keep a record of all work and other transactions pertaining to the roads in his sub-district, and shall furnish to the County Commissioners, on the first Tuesday of each month, a statement of the amount of labor performed or materials furnished, the cost of the same and to whom due; and said statement shall embrace, as near as possible, the entire expenses of his sub-district for the month just ended.

Subject to removal. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That all Road Commissioners shall be subject to removal by the County Commissioners for neglect or refusal to comply with the duties of their office; provided they shall be notified of the charge against them in writing by the County Commissioners, and summoned to appear before them at a stated time and answer the charge; and if any commissioner shall resign or be removed, his place shall be filled by the County Commissioners within thirty days after any vacancy shall occur.

Keep record for each district. SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the County Commissioners shall keep a book of record for each district, in which shall be recorded all the roads and bridges of that district, and all surveys and other
