

bridges to be erected, and to make specifications for all repairs on old bridges when the County Commissioners shall so direct; he shall superintend the building of all new bridges and such repairs as the commissioners may direct; he shall examine and report in writing upon all new bridges or repairs made to the said commissioners, and give his written opinion as to the strict performance of the terms of the contract by the contractors, and whether such work should be accepted or not; said superintendent may be removed from office by the County Commissioners for incompetency or neglect of duty, being first given an opportunity to defend himself against any charges, and the office may be filled by said commissioners at any time in the event of a vacancy.

Report in writing.

Order repairs

SEC. 21. *And be it enacted*, That whenever any bridge may need repairs to a small extent, in the opinion of the County Commissioners, they may order such repairs to be done under the direction of the Road Commissioners of the district, and whenever any new bridge shall be erected of greater length of span than twenty feet, such bridge shall be either a covered wooden bridge or of iron.

When expended.

Designate where roads lead

SEC. 22. *And be it enacted*, That at least three-fourths of all moneys to be expended for repairs of roads in each district shall be expended between the fifteenth day of April and the first day of October in each year; that the Road Commissioners of each district shall cause to be put up and maintained guide-posts and finger-boards at cross roads or where roads diverge from each other, designating the nearest prominent point to which such road leads and the distance thereto. Any person removing or defacing such finger-boards shall be liable to a fine of five dollars, to be imposed by a justice of the peace in the name of the County Commissioners.

Per diem

SEC. 23. *And be it enacted*, That the Road Commissioners to be appointed under this act shall be allowed a per diem of two dollars for each day they may be employed as examiners or superintendents of new roads to be altered, or of bridges to be built or repaired. That for their duties as Road Commissioners they shall be entitled to no pay except for
