said county, and to construct a public road or causeway from the foot of said bridge over the marsh public road or on the south side of Keene's ditch until it intersects causeway the main little Blackwater road to the town of Cambridge, in said county.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That if and when the said County Commissioners shall determine to build said bridge and construct said road, they shall proceed to advertise for at least twenty days, in at least one of the newspapers printed and published at the county sealed proposed seat of said county, for sealed proposals to build sals. said bridge, and shall award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder, who will give bond, with sureties to be approved by said County Commissioners, for the due performance of his part of the contract.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said bridge shall have a sufficient draw provided for all purposes of navigation, and the said County Commissioners Providediaw are hereby authorized to make and establish all needful regulations for the attendance to and care of said draw, including provision for an attendant, if they deem it necessary, and such compensation therefor as to them may seem just and [and] right in the premises.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the said County Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and empowered in constructing said road or causeway to contract for the purchase from the owner or owners of the necessary land or marsh, or condemn as in demn. other cases of opening public roads now provided by law, a bed for the same through and over the marsh and land from the said bridge to the intersection of such road or causeway, with the Little Blackwater road to Cambridge as aforesaid.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force. effect from the date of its passage.
