

peace of said county, be fined not less than three dollars or more than ten dollars for each offence, and upon failure to pay said fine and the cost of prosecution shall be sentenced to be confined in the county jail for a period not less than five days nor more than fifteen days.

**Fines—how disposed of.** SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That one-half of all fines imposed under this act shall be paid to the informer, and the other half to the County Commissioners for the use of the public roads.

**In force.** SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

#### CHAPTER 454.

AN ACT to authorize the Comptroller to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay James M. Anderson, late Collector of State Taxes for the city of Baltimore, a sum of money for commissions on taxes paid directly into the treasury.

**Pay commissions on taxes** SECTION 1. *And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay James M. Anderson, late Collector of State Taxes for the city of Baltimore, the sum of four hundred dollars, for commissions on taxes paid directly into the treasury.

**In force.** SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
