

**Justices shall produce dockets.** after being sworn to before the Mayor. Upon the request of the Council the said justices shall produce their dockets, and may be placed under oath and interrogated as to the entries therein. They shall pay over to the Treasurer quarterly all fines by them collected.

**Liable to indictment**  
**Fined and imprisoned.** SEC. 128. If either of the justices of the peace appointed by the Council fail or neglect to discharge any of the duties imposed upon him in this act, or refuse to pay over the fines by him collected, as herein directed, he shall be liable to indictment in the Circuit Court for Washington county, and upon conviction he shall be fined the sum of fifty dollars or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not exceeding three months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

**Mayor to nominate policemen.** SEC. 129. The Mayor shall have power to nominate such number of regular policemen, not exceeding five, as the Council shall deem necessary for the preservation of the peace and good order of the town, and such nominations shall be subject to confirmation or rejection by the Council; they may settle the duties of such policemen, dismiss them with or without cause, and fix their per diem or salaries; provided, however, that the salary of any regular policeman shall not exceed thirty dollars per month.

**Dismiss with or without cause.**

**Special policemen.** SEC. 130. The Mayor shall have power to appoint special policemen without the sanction of the Council, if in his judgment the exigencies of the town so require; provided, however, that the term of appointment shall not extend beyond a period of forty-eight hours.

**Book to be kept for subscribing to oath**  
**Power of policemen.** SEC. 131. Before any policeman, regular or special, shall act as such, he shall take and subscribe in a book, to be kept for that purpose, before the Mayor, the following oath: "I do swear (or affirm) that I will to the best of my ability discharge the duties of policeman of Hagerstown, in the enforcement of the ordinances of said town, without fear, favor or partiality." The policemen so appointed shall have all the powers of constables for the enforcement of the ordinances of the town and the preservation of it: peace and good order, and any person resisting a
