

for said county for the sale of liquors and other fermented spirits, which license shall be issued by said clerk as herein provided for issue of license by the Comptroller upon the payment to him of an equal amount of money therefor as is now or may hereafter be provided by law for a license from the State of Maryland, to be obtained as aforesaid from the Comptroller; and the money so paid for county license to the said clerk shall be by him paid into the public school fund of said county; and if any person shall proceed to sell or barter any liquor or other fermented spirits in such election district without having first obtained both of said licenses therefor, he shall, on conviction thereof, be fined not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars for each offence and costs, and be committed by the court until such fine and costs are paid.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That if it shall be found at such election, and proclaimed by the said clerk of court that a majority of the qualified votes have been cast "Against license" in any of said election districts wherein the sale of liquor or other fermented spirits is now licensed by law, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, firm, company or body corporate, on and after the first day of May in the year succeeding said election, to sell or otherwise dispose of by way of barter, directly or indirectly, any spirituous, fermented or other intoxicating liquors, or medicated bitters producing intoxication, or any compound of which alcohol forms the chief or a principal ingredient, or for any license to be issued or granted for the sale of the same in any such election district of the county aforesaid; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the compounding or sale of any such liquors by a regular pharmacist or druggist, having a license for such business under the laws of this State, upon the written *bona fide* prescription of a regular practising physician of such district, whose name shall be signed thereto; and every such prescription shall be filed and kept by such pharmacist or druggist, and no one prescription shall serve for more than one purchase; but no physician shall make or sign any such prescription unless the person for whom it is made is actually sick, or such liquor is absolutely required as a medicine; and any
