

policeman in the discharge of his duty, shall be liable to conviction and punishment in the same manner and to the same extent as if he had resisted a constable; and any policeman so appointed, who shall be guilty of official misconduct, shall be proceeded against by presentment and indictment in the Circuit Court for Washington county, and if found guilty, shall be fined or imprisoned, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

SEC. 132. The Mayor and Council shall have power to pass all ordinances not contrary to the constitution and laws of this State or of the United States, as they may deem necessary to the good government of the town; they shall have power to remove all nuisances or obstructions from the streets, lanes, alleys, or from any lots adjacent; to remove or cause to be removed, any houses or other structures that may in their judgment become dangerous to persons going upon the highways of the town; to cause the streets, alleys and sidewalks to be graded, paved, repaired and improved by the property owners or otherwise; to cause bridges or culverts to be made over the waters or hollows; to pave and keep in repair the water courses, drains or sewers of the town, and to keep the same well cleansed; to establish markets, regulate the hours and limits thereof, and mode of dealing thereat, and grant licenses or permits and rent stalls for the sale of marketable commodities; to control the public grounds, as over other parts of the town, but not to interfere with the title thereof; to establish and regulate a station-house or lock-up, for the temporary confinement of violators of the laws and ordinances of the town; to prohibit or restrain the keeping of bawdy houses, or houses of ill fame, within the limits of the town, and to provide for the punishment of all persons who shall keep, authorize or suffer to be kept any such bawdy house, or house of ill fame, and for the purpose of carrying out the foregoing powers, and for the preservation of the cleanliness, the health, the peace and good order of the community, and for the protection of the lives and property of the citizens, they may pass all ordinances or by-laws from time to time necessary; and to ensure the observance of said ordinances, in addition to the action of debt, or such
