Sec. 133. The Mayor and Council shall have power to provide for laying out, opening and extending, Stree's and widening, straightening or closing of any street or alley in said town, which in their judgment public convenience or necessity may require, and for the purposes above named, they may provide by ordinance for ascertaining whether any and what amount of damages will be caused thereby, for which the owner or possessor of any lands through or over which such street or alley may pass ought to be compensated and paid, and for ascertaining and levying, either generally on the whole assessable property of the town or specially on property of the persons benefitted, the whole or any part of the damages and expenses occasioned in the laying out, opening and extending, widening, straightening or closing of such street or alley; to provide, in case they shall determine to levy and assess the whole or any part of said damages and expenses upon the owner or owners of the amount of such damages and expenses so determined to be levied upon them, in due proportion to the amount of benefits by them respectively re-Commission- ceived; to provide for the appointment of commisers to assess sioners to assess said damages and benefits, and prescribe their duties and compensation; to provide for the condemnation of all lands and property so taken for public use; for the notice to be given in relation thereto; for the payment of the damages so awarded, and for the collection and mode of payment under any action allowed by law of the benefits so determined and assessed; to pass all ordinances necessary and proper to the exercise of the powers granted in this section; provided, however, that no lands or property shall be taken under the powers
