

poration in a well bound book, to be provided by the commissioners for that purpose, and shall annually or oftener, if required, render to the commissioners an account thereof; but before said treasurer shall enter upon the duties of his office, he shall give bond payable to said commissioners in such penalty as they may fix, with securities to be approved by them, conditioned that he will well and faithfully account for all monies paid over to him by the bailiff of said town, or any other person or persons, for the use and benefit of said corporation, and shall also well and truly pay to the order of said commissioners, or a majority of them, all sums of money so received by him, and the said bond shall be recorded among the records of said corporation; and the said treasurer shall qualify and enter upon the duties of his office on or before the first Monday in June succeeding his election, and a failure to qualify within the time herein specified shall be deemed a refusal to accept the office, whereupon the commissioners shall order a new election to fill the vacancy; and it shall be the duty of the commissioners to cause to be issued certificate of election to person receiving the highest number of votes for treasurer of said town, and in case of a tie vote for the office of treasurer, the commissioners shall order a new election.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the following additional sections be added to the act of eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter two hundred and sixty, entitled "An act to incorporate the town of Laurel, in Prince George's county," to follow after section twenty-nine of said act.

SEC. 30. *And be it enacted*, That the first and all subsequent elections held under this act, the commissioners shall give at least ten days' notice of the same, and shall be held at such places as they may designate; and the judges thereof shall be three in number, and be designated and appointed by the said commissioners at least ten days prior to holding said election, and give public notice of the same; the said judges shall appoint two clerks, and shall keep the polls open from two o'clock P. M. to six o'clock P. M., when they shall be closed and the ballots publicly counted; and they shall, within two days after said election, make a true and correct re-
