

shall not exceed the sum of five dollars on any of the aforesaid vehicles for one year.

License on traders. SEC. 137. They shall have power to demand a license from all persons who vend any articles upon the public streets, or who go from house to house to make sale of the same, or who expose any articles for sale upon the public streets; and also upon all transient traders or itinerant peddlers; provided, however, that the license fee in any case shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five dollars.

License for showmen and others. SEC. 138. They shall have power to demand a license from all players or showmen exhibiting within said town, and also from all venders of patent medicines, and from all travelling persons who dispense medicines or medical advice; provided, however, that the license fee in any such case shall not exceed the sum of fifty dollars.

May levy. SEC. 139. The said Mayor and Council may annually levy upon the taxable property of the town a sum not exceeding thirty cents on every hundred dollars worth of assessable property for general purposes, and such further sum or sums as may be now authorized by law for the liquidation of the town indebtedness; said taxes, when levied, shall be a lien upon property, as now provided by law, and they may be collected as State and county taxes are collected, or by such other means as the Mayor and Council may by ordinance adopt.

Duty of Treasurer. SEC. 140. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep all moneys coming into his hands, separate, and to devote them to the purposes for which they were levied or collected, and in his annual statement, which shall be published in at least one newspaper of the town for two weeks prior to the regular municipal election, he shall show to the citizens of the town that said moneys have been kept distinct, and so applied.

Appeal. SEC. 141. From any judgment rendered by either of the police justices in enforcement of the ordinances of the town, an appeal shall lie by the person aggrieved to the Circuit Court for Washington county; provided, the appeal is entered immediately upon
